

The importance of Reception

- Holds a unique and important position in education.
- Milestone in a child's life beginning and an end.
- Parents end of early education and care, at home and/or across pre-school setting/s, and the start of school.
- School staff crucial bridge between the Early Years Foundation Stage (birth to 5 years old) and the start of the National Curriculum taught through all subsequent school years.

What does learning look like in Reception?

- Carpet learning time direct teaching from adults
- Inside and outside
- Enabling Environment- different learning opportunities in zoned classroom
- Purposeful play and practical learning
- 'Finding out and Exploring' child-initiated play



Our Curriculum

- Considers children's starting points what they already know, what they should developmentally be able to do next.
- Carefully sequenced planned and deliberately taught
- Broad and balanced rich opportunities to talk, learn new vocabulary and make links in their learning.
- Activities and opportunities are designed to be engaging
- Adult interactions encourage children to build on their prior knowledge move learning forward.
- Opportunities to revisit prior learning rehearse and practice skills and knowledge learnt
- Designed to prepare the children for the next stage of learning – Year 1 and the National Curriculum

- Social interactions making needs known in appropriate way, asking for help, engaging in conversation
- Awareness of their own and other's emotions- naming emotions, learning how to regulate these in an ageappropriate way
- Tolerating delay turn taking, waiting for needs to be met as part of a class of 24

The definition – skills to practice before starting Reception


New skills take time to learn. Practicing at home will help your child move into school more easily and with confidence.


