Local governors get to know the school and gain a good understanding of the school's priorities, strengths and weaknesses. They provide strategic monitoring of the school's improvement priorities. Local governors act in the best interest of all the pupils and staff of the school.





What experience or skills do I need?

No previous experience is necessary. You would be joining a local governing board with a range of experience and skills. The Trust and school will provide support and training to help settle you in. What could you bring to the team?

What do I enjoy about being a local governor? Making a difference and seeing the children flourish.

Why am I a local governor? I think children's time at school is really important and I want to do what I can to help.

What is the time commitment?

Once in post and with training completed we'd expect the monthly time commitment to be anything from 3 to 8 hours per month depending on what additional tasks or responsibilities you have taken on.
